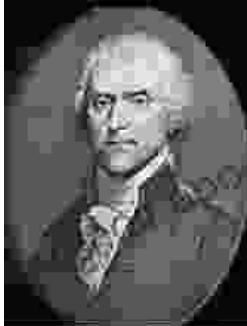
Jefferson also recognized the dangers of excessive government power. He warned against the tyranny of the majority and the need for a balance of powers to protect individual rights and freedoms.

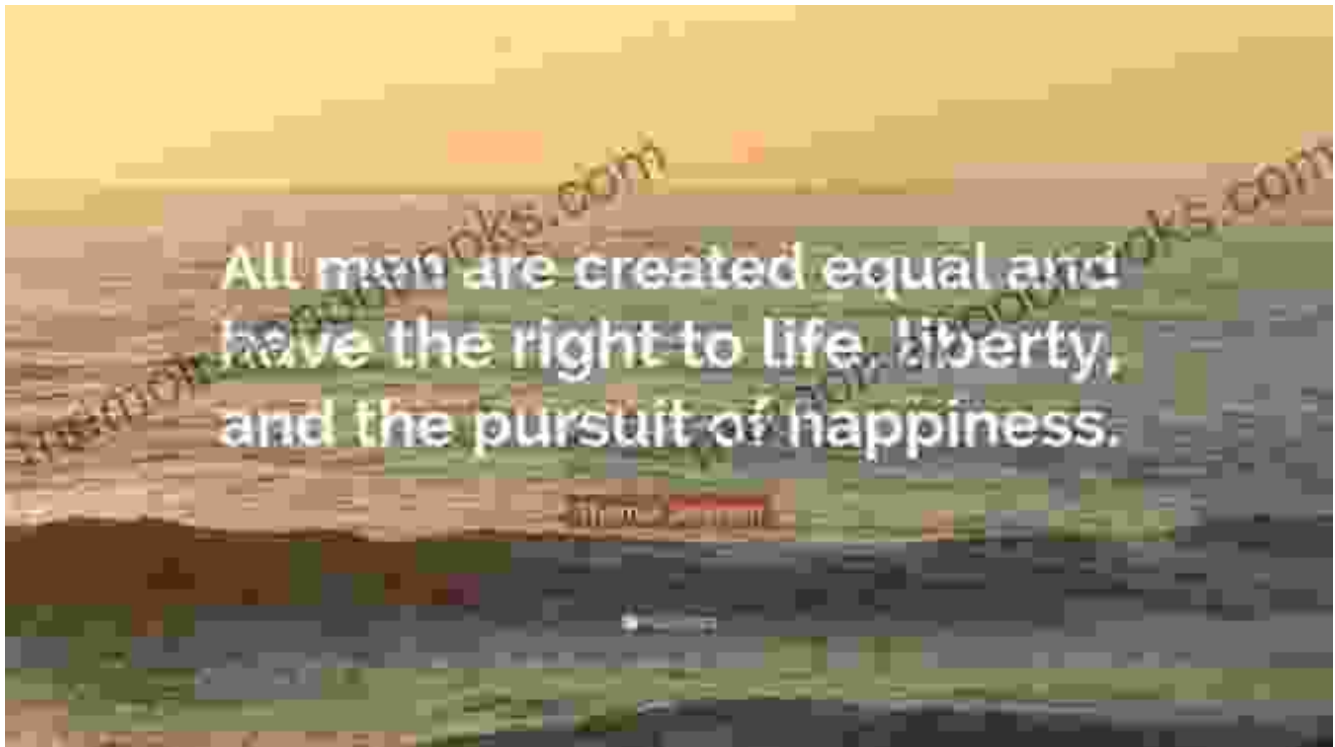

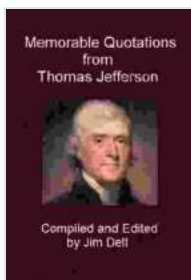

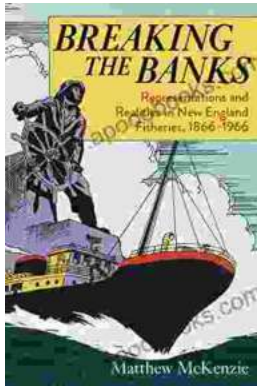
